Results

- ▶ E3 has ignited a movement; a growing network, currently numbering 7,000 organizations and individuals committed to realizing the E3 vision for revitalizing education and building healthy, thriving communities.
- ▶ Through E3, experts and stakeholders from 12 diverse sectors and 18 regions joined together to form learning communities and mutually reinforcing strategies for greater impact.
